Ukrainian Students Launch “Bitter Harvest” Film Across Canada To Shine Light on Forgotten Genocide

The Ukrainian Canadian Students' Union (SUSK), together with its local chapters (Manitoba's Ukrainian Canadian Students Society - MUCSS and The University of Winnipeg Ukrainian Students Association - UWUKRSA) and D Films, is launching a series of pre-launch events of the highly anticipated feature film, '*Bitter Harvest*,' a film depicting the overlooked artificial famine imposed on Ukraine in 1932-33 ('*Holodomor*'), deliberately eliminating millions of Ukrainians, by the Stalin Regime.

Though the movie will be launched nationwide on March 3rd, SUSK has secured access and will launch **free** pre-screenings on campuses on Wednesday March 1st at 7 pm across Canada, including The Multi-Purpose Room at University Centre (University of Manitoba Fort Garry Campus).
