The Weir Award

The Department of Environment and Geography established an award in honour of Dr. T.R. Weir. Dr. Weir founded the Department of Geography in 1951, served as Head from 1951 to 1971 and was a Professor Emeritus.

The Weir Award is to be offered once each calendar year for the most outstanding Master's Thesis presented by a student in the department. The recipient will receive a cash prize in the amount of the interest earned on the fund as well as a certificate and letter.

The selection committee will include the Head, Associate Head and Chair of the Graduate Studies Committee in the Department of Environment and Geography. No award is to be made in years when the selection committee considers that there is not an outstanding thesis.

Student program advisors are invited to submit a letter of nomination to the department explaining why the thesis is worthy of the award.
