7. For Information/Discussion - PhD in Rehabilitation Sciences Program Proposal
The College of Rehabilitation Sciences (CoRS) is proposing a new program – a PhD in Rehabilitation
Sciences. The proposal was approved at CoRS Council Dec 16, 2024, and now sits with FGS. The program
will require a minimum of 12 credit hours of courses (18 credit hours for students entering with a
professional Master's degree instead of a thesis-based Master's), two not-for-credit seminar courses, a
candidacy exam, a thesis proposal, and a thesis defense. Intake is proposed to be 4 students per year
(which will result in an enrolment of 16-20 students after 4-5 years). Three new courses are included in the
proposal. CoRS is requesting funding for 2.5 FTE professorial stream faculty to support the program.
