Advances Indigenous pedagogy, research and scholarship. (Max 250 words)

Fosters a greater understanding of Indigenous knowledge, cultures and traditions amongst students, staff and faculty. (Max 250 words)

Demonstrates visionary thinking that has resulted in advancing Indigenous engagement at the University of Manitoba with continued impact. (Max 250 words)

You may attach up to two single-page letters of support from students, faculty, staff, and/or community supporters to accompany the nomination. It is helpful to share the criteria for the award with those providing the letters so that their statements are informed by the criteria; it should be clear how the contributions relate to the specific award criteria. These letters offer an opportunity to show the contribution of the nominee from different perspectives. The impact of the letter is not weighted by the status of the individual providing the letter, but their ability to speak about the contributions the nominee has made.
