- Effective November 2014, the Faculties of Dentistry, Medicine, Nursing, and Pharmacy became colleges in the Faculty of Health Sciences.
The College of Rehabilitation Sciences (formerly, the School of Medical Rehabilitation) and the School of Dental Hygiene also became part of the new faculty.
- Physiology & Pathophysiology was previously reported as Physiology.
- Beginning Fall Term 2014, the Master's in Social Work has a revised program structure. Students enrolled prior to 2014 will complete under the previous program.
Leadership, Management & Policy is a stream under the revised structure.
