1. Excludes pre-master's students. Pre-master's students included in Graduate Studies. Previously, enrolment was reported separately for Distance Education students. This breakdown is not currently available and therefore Distance Education students are included in their respective faculties/colleges/schools.
2. Winter Term reports are based on data extracted as at March 1. Winter Term 2017 used an adjusted date of March 15 as that term began two weeks later than usual.
3. Effective Fall Term 2014, the Department of Human Nutritional Sciences moved from the Faculty of Human Ecology to the Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences. Comparisons with previous years should be made with caution.
4. Effective July 1, 2015, the Faculty of Human Ecology's programs and departments joined other academic units within the university. Students in Textile Sciences are now reported under the Faculty of Agricultural & Food Sciences. Students in Family Social Sciences are now reported under the Max Rady College of Medicine. Students in Health Sciences/Health Studies are now reported under the Rady Faculty of Health Sciences.
5. School of Agriculture was previously reported within Agricultural and Food Sciences as Diploma.
6. Direct entry from high school introduced in Fall Term 2013.
7. Effective November 2014, the Faculties of Dentistry, Medicine, Nursing, and Pharmacy became colleges in the Rady Faculty of Health Sciences. The College of Rehabilitation Sciences (formerly, the School of Medical Rehabilitation) and the School of Dental Hygiene also became part of the new faculty.
8. The Faculty of Health Sciences changed its name to the Rady Faculty of Health Sciences in 2016.
9. Beginning in 2017, the Rady Faculty of Health Sciences has an option for admission directly from high school.
10. Other Dentistry includes B.Sc. Dentistry students and students in the International Dentist Degree Program.
11. The College of Medicine changed its name to the Max Rady College of Medicine in 2016.
12. Other Medicine includes B.Sc. Medicine students and physicians enrolled in Continuing Medical Education courses.
