3. The Faculty of Engineering changed its name to the Price Faculty of Engineering in 2020.
4. Due to the diversity of degrees available through the Clayton H. Riddell Faculty of Environment, Earth, and Resources, these program costs are an approximation based on 90 credit hours for a three-year degree and 120 credit hours for a four-year degree.
5. The College of Dentistry changed its name to the Dr. Gerald Niznick College of Dentistry in 2018.
6. The cost for programs in the Dr. Gerald Niznick College of Dentistry and the Max Rady College of Medicine are calculated by multiplying the cost per standard student by the number of years required to attain a degree.
7. These costs reflect the two-year clinical component of the Dental Hygiene Diploma program.
8. Pharmacy is transitioning from a B.Sc. Pharmacy to a PharmD program, beginning in Fall Term 2019. Beginning with the 2020-21 reporting period, costs are calculated by multiplying the cost per standard student by the number of years required to attain a degree
