4. Due to the diversity of degrees available through the Clayton H. Riddell Faculty of Environment, Earth, and Resources, these program costs are an approximation based on 90 credit hours for a three-year degree and 120 credit hours for a four-year degree.
5. The cost for programs in the Dr. Gerald Niznick College of Dentistry and the Max Rady College of Medicine are calculated by multiplying the cost per standard student by the number of years required to attain a degree.
6. These costs reflect the two-year clinical component of the Dental Hygiene Diploma program.
