1. Program costs are calculated by multiplying the average cost per credit hour in a given faculty by the number of credit hours required to attain a degree. The number of credit hours that are required for a degree are taken from the General Calendar.
2. Due to the diversity of degrees available through the Clayton H. Riddell Faculty of Environment, Earth, and Resources, these program costs are an approximation based on 90 credit hours for a three-year degree and 120 credit hours for a four-year degree.
3. The cost for programs in the Dr. Gerald Niznick College of Dentistry and the Max Rady College of Medicine are calculated by multiplying the cost per standard student by the number of years required to attain a degree.
4. These costs reflect the two-year clinical component of the Dental Hygiene program.
5. Pharmacy is transitioning from a B.Sc. Pharmacy to a PharmD program, beginning in Fall Term 2019. The reported cost is calculated by multiplying the cost per student by the number of years required to attain a degree.
