
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A Pictorial Review 1978 - 1979




Gordon Charles Beaulieu

Gerald came back from down east and now wants to be a punk lawyer. He was a highlight of the brilliant "beer & skits" performances of 1979.




Patricia June Brownell




Valdyn Jonina Duke


Timothy Paul Friesen




Barry Lee Gorlick




Michael William Gumprich




Kenneth Dale Harvey




Patricia Vivian Hilder




Donald Brigden Houston


Eric Brock Irwin




Victor Frank Janzen


Timothy James Patrick Killeen


Donald Ray Knight




Dawn Arlene Lampe





Frank Lavitt




Harris Henry Leck


John Francis McGee




Trevor Lorne Maguire


Claire Iris Moglove




James Murray Pasieka

A fixture on the rads, was finally granted an easement. Contrary to popular belief, Ellen did know where the library was - she even went up there once to find a fourth for bridge.






Gail Frances Poole







Rodrique Charles Roy




Shalom Dov Ber Schachter




Lindsay Shaddy





Robert Phillip Sokalski
