


Dean's Message


Congratulations to the Class of '83. You have survived with flying colours the first of the ways through which you must wend on the road to professional and personal fulfillment. There are two quick observations to be made. First, most of you will not be required ever again to face greater anxiety or pressure than that associated with 100% final examinations at the Faculty of Law. Each April, even after all these years, I myself continue to feel pains of empathy and sympathy for this brutal, if necessary, ritual. Having survived these tests, though that is not their point, you may be confident of your ability to handle yourselves in just about any situation you may encounter.

Second, you now have a responsibility which extends beyond you alone. No longer will you be the centres of your universes. Instead, you will now be expected to render service both to your employers, your clients and your community. You have been privileged to graduate from a leading professional faculty. You must now determine how you will exercise that privilege and how, in the process, you will benefit others. Some of you will see the law degree, and ultimately the practitioner's licence, as a money printing machine. There are many frontiers to challenge. Pressing native rights; women's rights; the rights of the economically disadvantaged; assisting the victims of stereotypical assumptions and the "isms" which go with that evil; and much more, are goals and ideals worth pursuing and commitments worth making.

You have been blessed with a first rate legal education. I charge you now to do something more with it than simply enter the marketplace.
