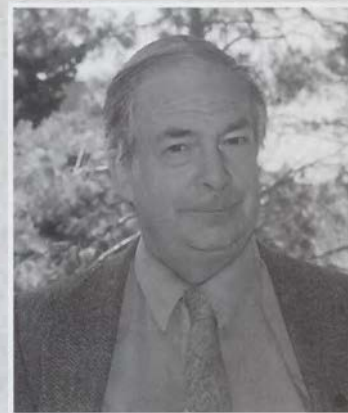

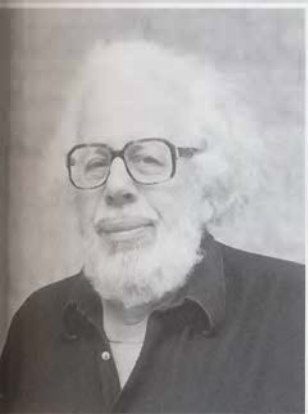

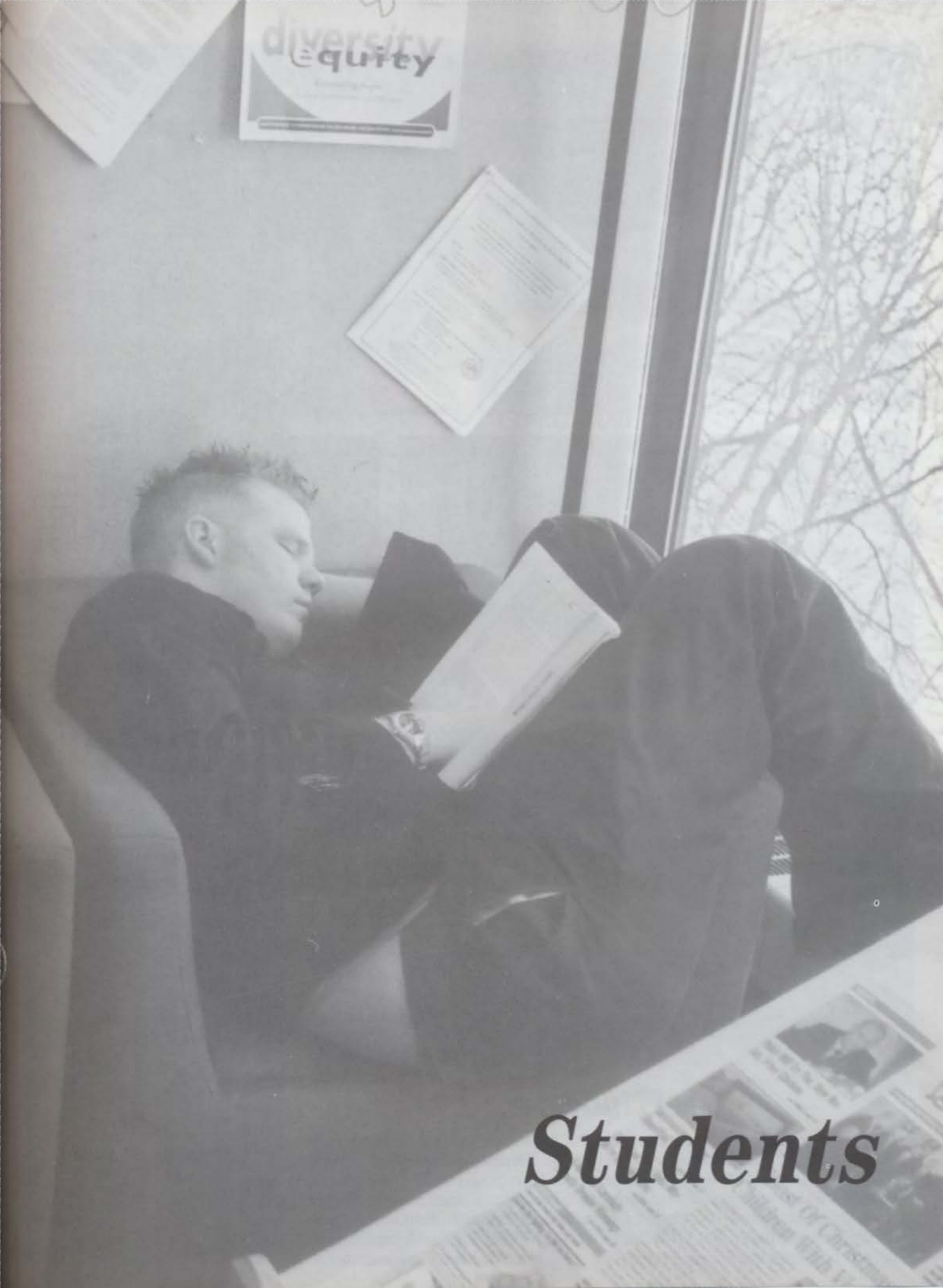
## *In Memoriam: Joanne Burke*

# Mentor Program

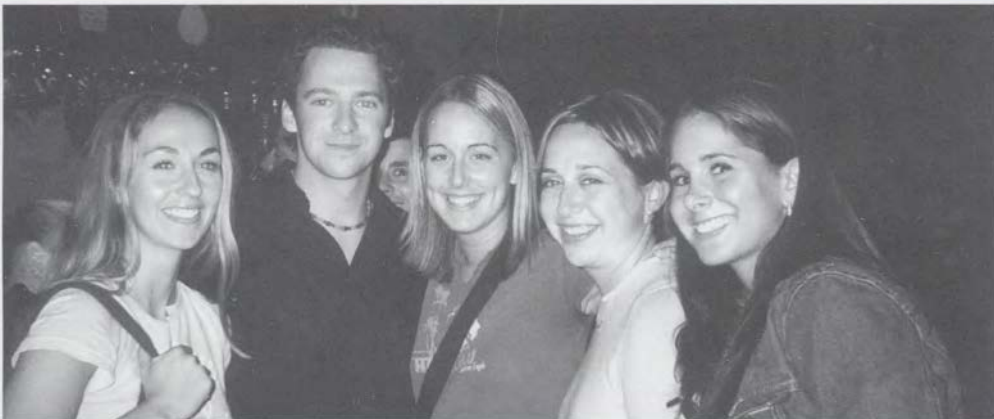
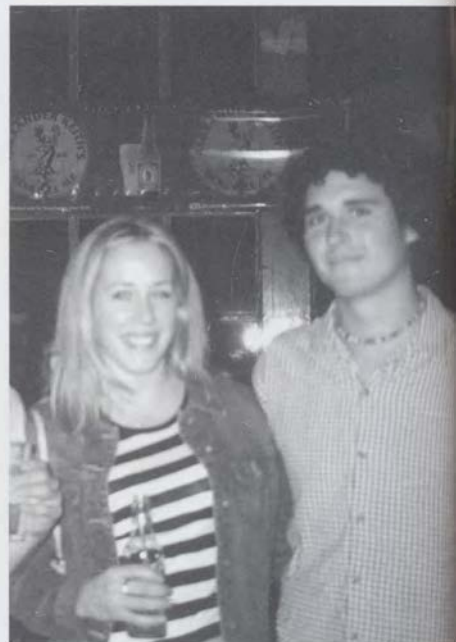
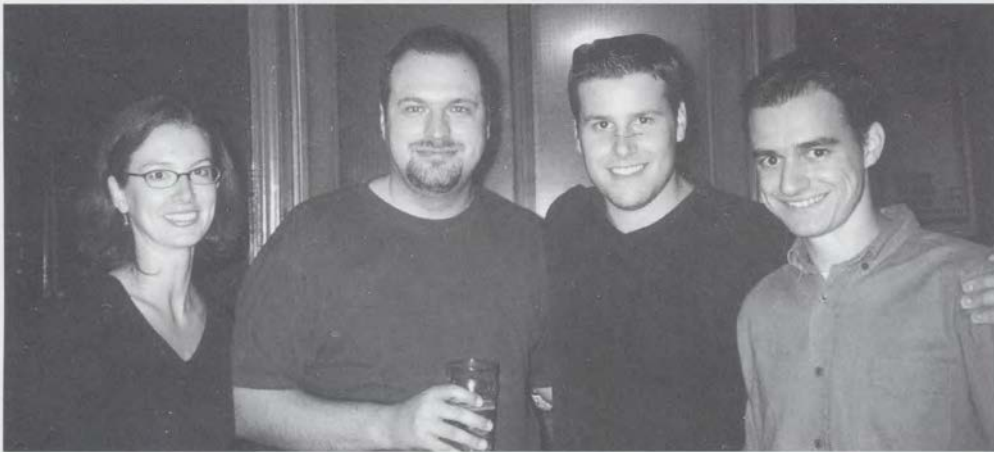
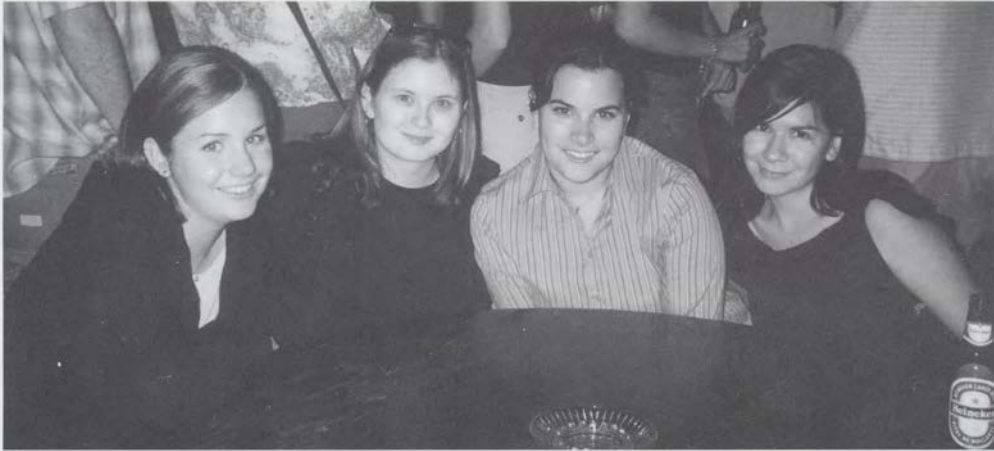

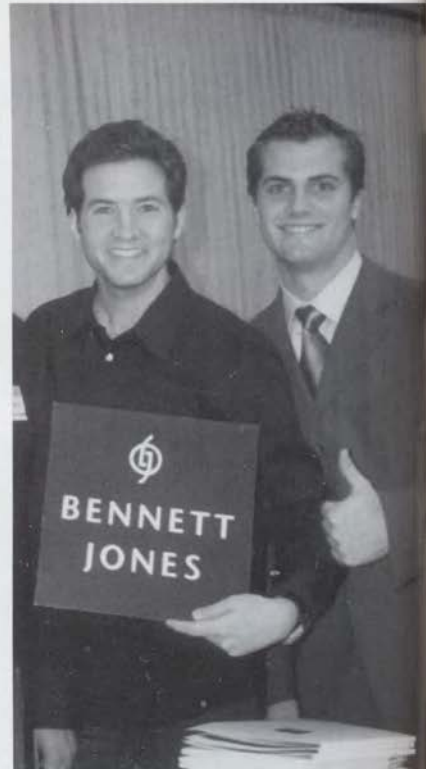
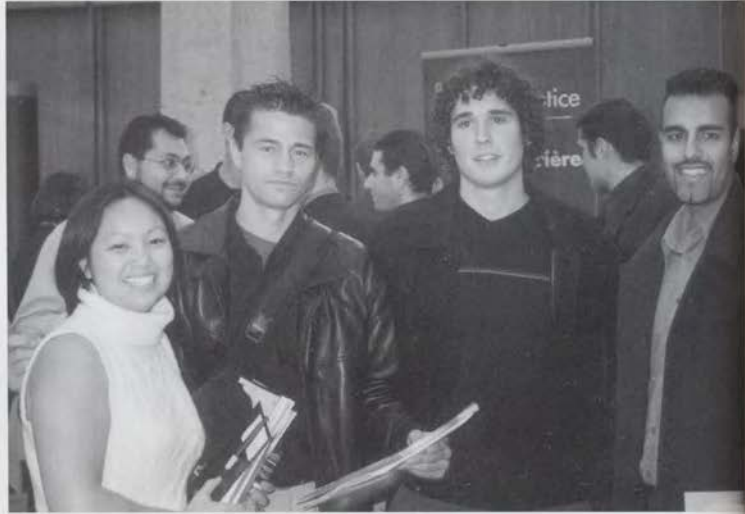


# Career Day

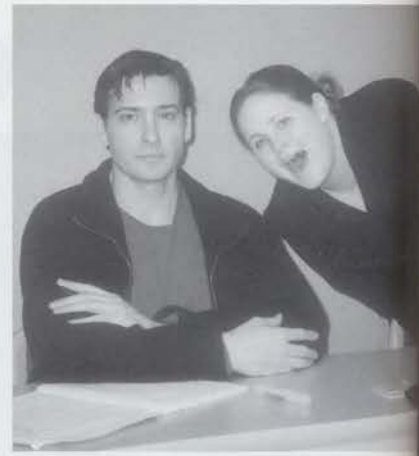


Dear reader:

# Cliff Edwards Invitational Hockey Tournament

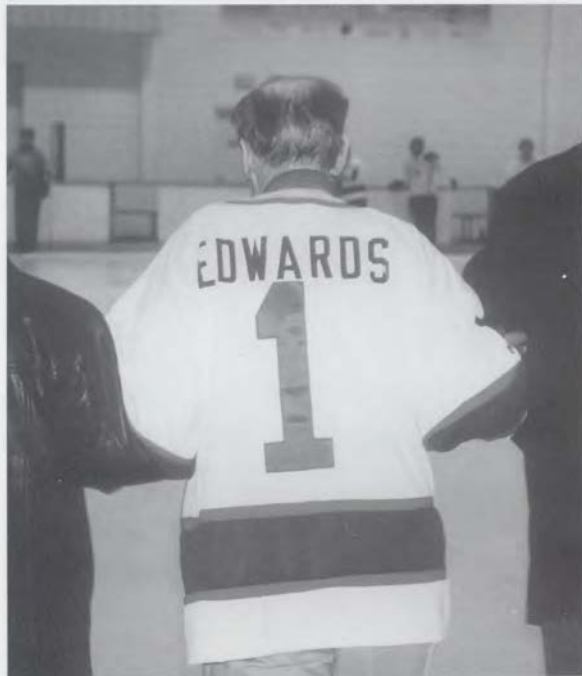
