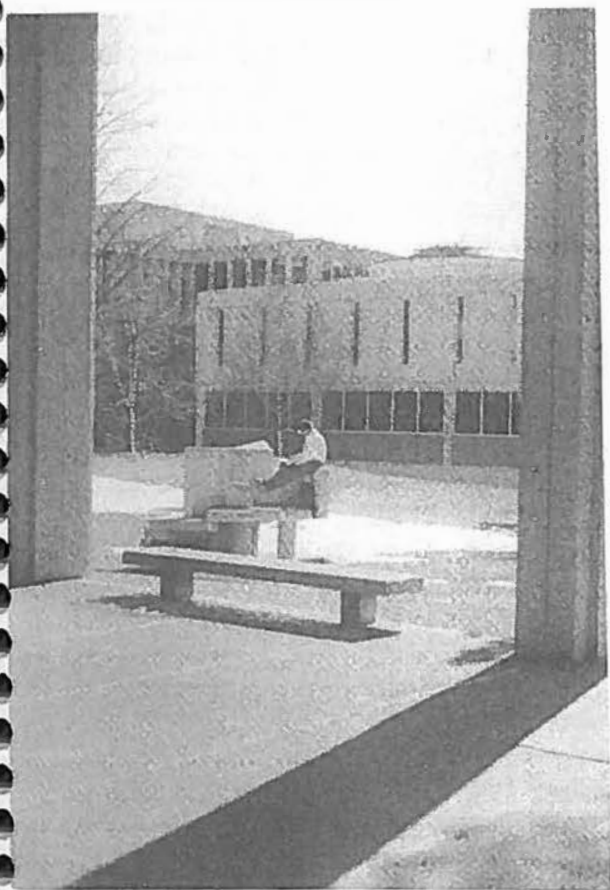

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# Dean's Messages

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This past year has witnessed a "legal explosion" of very significant proportions, not all of it good; but all of it testifying to the increasing importance of law, particularly in an advanced and complex society such as Canada. Examples abound: The Meech Lake constitutional crisis while, in my view, essentially political in nature was more often than not argued at the level of constitutional law; the biggest segment of the work of the Supreme Court of Canada has been in the area of constitutional law, particularly the law of the Charter of Rights and Freedoms (pursuant to which complex issues of social policy formerly resolved at the political level has been resolved at the judicial level); the media's love affairs with the law continues, especially television's L.A. Law and its Canadian clone Street Legal; law has become, increasingly, big business, even international business; the technical revolution of this information age has finally begun to displace the "quill pen" approach to law office practice and management and has been a boon to both practice and pedagogy. For good or for ill there is an increasing turn to the law in the search for solutions to pressing problems such as the dangers to our environment.

All of this has created enormous demands on our faculty and enormous opportunities for you, our primary constituents. With over 950 applications for our 90 first year places we continue to face issues of access, a primary issue if we really believe in equality of opportunity. Questions of access are most pressing and most poignant with respect to Manitoba's aboriginal population. We have to do much more in integrating our curriculum internally and externally with other disciplines. The creation of a computer teaching facility and related teaching programs has moved up from the desirable to the urgent. We are just now embarking on the creation of just such a "computer lab". We must examine critically the depth and breadth of our offerings with respect to such matters as environmental law, economic regulation, international trade law and aboriginal justice. And in all of this we will need, as we have never needed before, your support as students and as graduates.

Our graduates leave here with as fine a grounding in the fundamentals of law as can be obtained anywhere in Canada. For all of you, whether headed for practice or not, your degree has placed you on a very promising and challenging road for the rest of your career-oriented lives. We will, let me promise you, be calling upon you to support us in our constant effort to understand and deal with the "legal explosion". You will be hearing from us; we hope that, in many ways, we will be hearing from you.

President, Duncan Fraser, for its positive response to my gentle prodding to do something about repairing this long-standing omission. The publication of the 1990 and 1991 Yearbooks is well overdue. You would be surprised at the number of graduates who, when called upon to support the Faculty of Law Endowment Fund, respond that no donation will be forthcoming until they receive the Yearbook that had been promised and for which they had paid.

It is of course one of my premises (no longer inarticulate) that if the Yearbook is finally published then the graduates will be so overwhelmed with gratitude that when the canvasser calls they will respond with alacrity and generosity. That's the theory anyway! We hope that you enjoy your Yearbook.

**David Broadley**

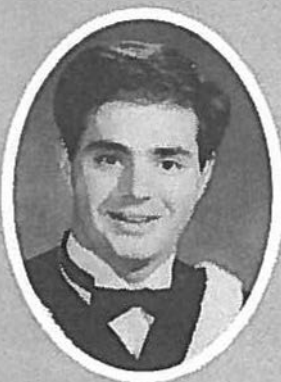

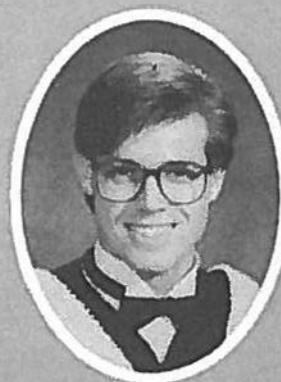
*Patrick Cummins*

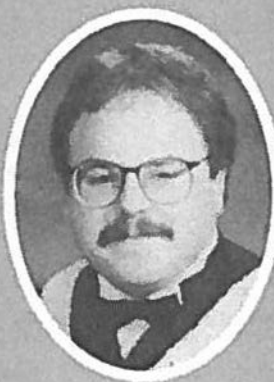
### Sanjay Goorachurn
