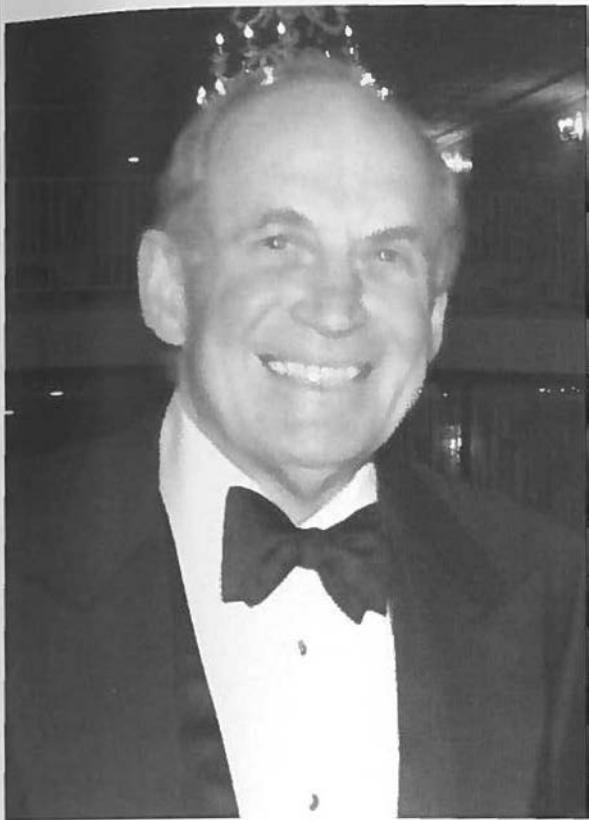

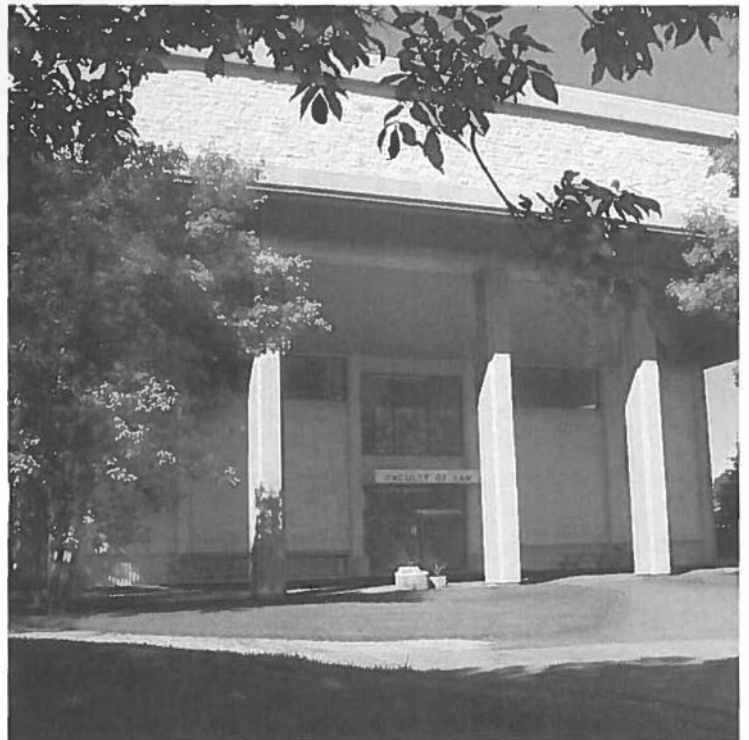

Associate Dean Turnbull's Message



The three years that the class of 2007 has spent at Robson Hall have been dynamic and productive. When the class of 2001 arrived in September 2004, Prof. Cam Harvey was in the last of his 16 years as Associate Dean and the tuition surcharge was finally becoming fully implemented. Professor Schulz had just joined the faculty, but students struggled to find her as she was hiding in a makeshift office in the library. The library expansion was complete but the Research Centre was not yet developed. Financial Aid program was beginning to unfold, but entrance awards were not yet in place.

Now, a mere 32 months later, the class of 2007 is about to graduate from an energized and forward-looking law school that committed to excellence as they are. Professors Oshionebo and Heckman have joined us, the Desautels Centre for Private Enterprise of the Law has opened in the newly developed fourth floor research centre, nearly 60% of those who received bursars received aid in excess of the tuition surcharge and we have a career placement service staffed by a committed and well-connected member of the Manitoba Bar. Entrance scholarships recognize excellence for newly admitted students and the Pitblado scholarships continue to reward the high academic achievements of the students on the Dean's List.

I have served as the Associate Dean for the past two years and have been thrilled by the momentum that is building in Robson Hall. Students have contributed positively to many of the changes that have occurred, from the new approaches to the curriculum timetable and course selection to the revision of the grading policies of the faculty. All that we accomplish whether individually or together serves to enhance your education while you are here and the reputation of your school when you leave. It has been a privilege to have gotten to know many of you, to have worked with you, to have faced challenges and developed solutions together. I know that each of you will leave Robson Hall well equipped to use your skills and talents to make a difference in the world, and I wish you all the best.

Justice Marshall Rothstein Visits Robson Hall



Justice Marshall Rothstein, the newest member of the Supreme Court of Canada, returned to his alma mater on November 2 and delivered an engaging talk to students and faculty about his experience of the novel process in which he was interviewed by a special Parliamentary committee before his appointment. He paid special tribute to Dean-Emeritus Cliff Edwards for having sparked his initial interest in the law. Justice Rothstein also spoke to interested students about clerkships in the Supreme Court, Federal Court, and Federal Court of Appeal. While in Winnipeg, he also participated in the annual Pitblado Lectures, co-sponsored by the Faculty of Law.

Manitoba made an impressive debut at the national Wilson Moot competition held in Toronto on March 2-3, 2007, placing second to Osgoode Hall in the final. Allison Fenske was also named one of three Top Oralists.

The Manitoba team of Sarah Bahir, Allison Fenske, Eric Hachinski, and Jason Harvey was the top overall team heading into the final, based on cumulative oral advocacy and factum scores. Thwarted by poor weather in Toronto on Thursday, the team's plane was delayed late into the night and then finally rerouted to Ottawa. After managing to rent an SUV at the Ottawa airport at 1:20 a.m., the team drove through an ice storm on the 401 highway, and arrived at the Federal Court in Toronto at 8:50 a.m. for a scheduled 9:00 a.m. moot by the Appellants, Sarah and Eric.

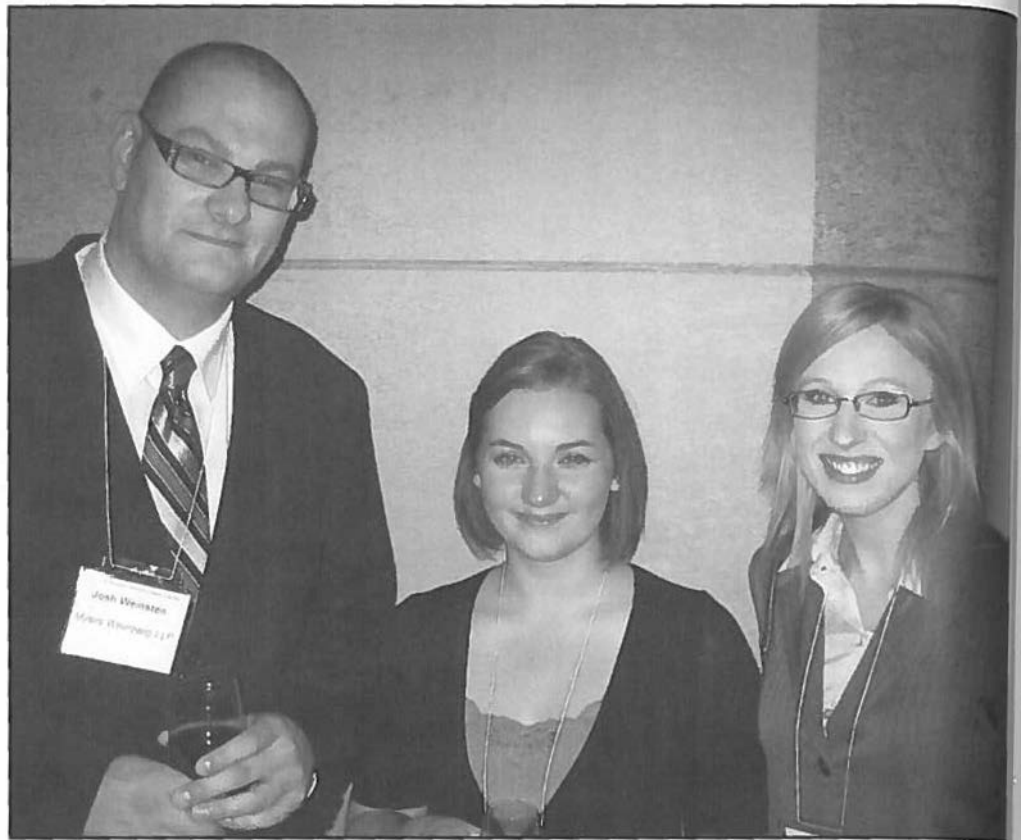

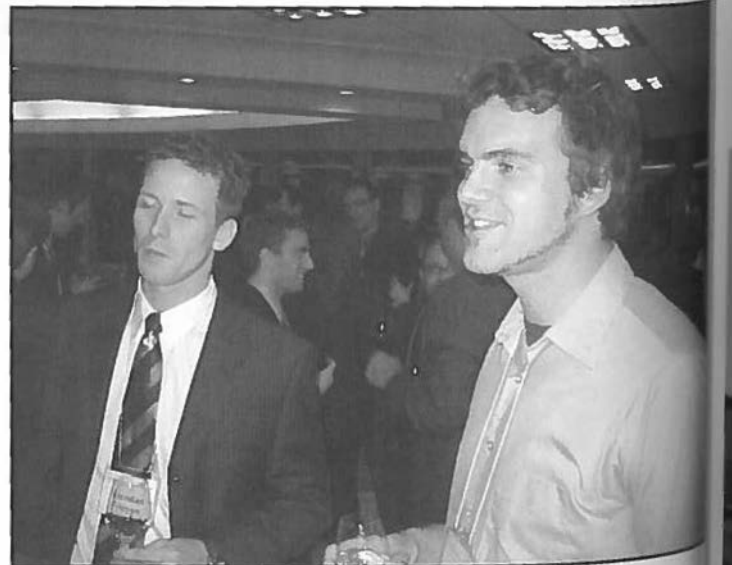
MENTORSHIP PROGRAM – Getting Connected with the Legal Community

The Mentorship Program is designed to connect first year students with Manitoba lawyers. The goal of the program is for students to gain practical information about the practice of law, and to allow lawyers a chance to get to know future members of the profession.
