DEAN'S MESSAGE

The Class of '82 will have much to remember on those nostalgic occasions when it gathers to celebrate its major anniversaries of graduation. Indeed, it might be rewarding for each of us to jot down one or two thoughts, simply to aid what later may be a failing recollection. Let me do that now.

This year I feel more than just the normal affinity of a teacher for his students. Your entry into First Year coincided with my appointment as Dean of the Faculty. Thereafter, though we have not always seen eye to eye on matters of policy, an inevitable result in a period of transition, your three years here have marked the beginnings of a new era of progressive education, highlighted by improved grading systems; more intimate student - teacher ratios; and, above all, a new dedication to excellence in learning, teaching and professionalism.
