In memory of Dr. Jal Tata, a faculty member in the College of Rehabilitation Sciences who passed away in 1980, his wife, Liz, and the Tata family, established an endowment fund at the University of Manitoba in 2003. Dr. Tata was committed to research which would advance physiotherapy practice. This scholarship recognizes a student with high academic standing who is conducting research highly relevant to physiotherapy (including, but not limited to, clinical practice, health promotion, health policy, and education).

Eligibility:

- 1. a four-year bachelor's degree (or equivalent) in physiotherapy;
- 2. enrolled full-time in the Faculty of Graduate Studies in the Master of Science (MSc) in Rehabilitation Sciences program offered by the College of Rehabilitation Sciences; and
- 3. achieved a minimum grade point average of 3.5 based on the last 60 credit hours (or equivalent) of study.
