As we work together to gradually and safely ramp up on-campus activities at UM, we need to remain committed to following public health directives that help ensure the health of our community members and prevent the spread of COVID-19. Please ensure you are familiar with the following information before returning to campus for approved, essential work.

As areas are gradually allowed to ramp-up essential on-campus activities, the following must be taken into consideration:

Work from home must be prioritized for all work / activities that can be carried out remotely.

All essential on-campus activities must undergo a review by the Recovery Working Group before moving forward. Plans to resume activity should ensure the 2-meter physical distance requirement can be respected. Strategies for maintaining the distance requirement include re-arranging workspaces, staggering shifts, etc.

Essential on-campus activities where the 2-meter physical distance cannot be respected must undergo a review to identify alternatives or added requirements that must be implemented to ensure health and safety of staff and students.
