Campus living

Your time in residence will be one of the most memorable and rewarding parts of your UM experience. Our buildings are equipped with furnished rooms, free high-speed Internet, study spaces, lounges and laundry facilities. Be sure to apply early as residence rooms fill up quickly.

The cost of living on campus varies based on your building, room style and meal plan preference. Residence packages range from \$9,700–\$16,300 per academic year (Sept–April).

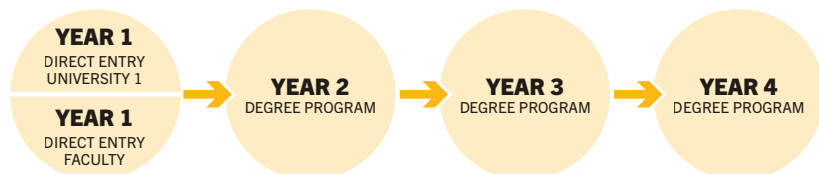
Scholarships

High school students applying for the Fall Term by March 1 with an equivalent minimum average of 85% in five senior level academic courses (from an approved list) may qualify for entrance scholarships ranging from \$1,000–\$3,000 CAD.

Admission requirements

If you are coming to university directly from high school, or have completed less than one year of university studies, you'll take the **direct entry route** into a faculty or program: this means either beginning in University 1 (U1) or applying to a program that offers a direct entry option.



Students who have completed 24 credit hours or more of university study can apply as a transfer student to a program via the **advanced entry route**. External transfer students *may* receive up to a maximum of two years (60 credit hours) of transferable credit to be applied towards a UM degree.

Preparatory programs

UM requires a minimum 6.5 IELTS (min 6.0 in each module) or 86 TOEFL (min of 20 in each area). Consider a preparatory program if you do not meet the requirements.

The English Language Centre's Intensive Academic English Program (IAEP) prepares you for university studies by providing you with the language skills necessary to succeed academically. Conditional admission to the University of Manitoba is possible by successfully completing Level 5 of the IAEP.

Application process

1. APPLY

APPLY TO UM

With three flexible intakes per year, you can begin your studies in September, January (select programs only) or May (select programs only).

Fall term deadline: March 1*

Winter term deadline: October 1

Summer term deadline: February 1

Submit a joint English Language Centre (ELC) + undergraduate studies application if you do not meet the English language proficiency requirements. Conditional admission may be granted on the basis of successfully completing Level 5 of the IAEP.

\$295 CAD (ELC + undergraduate studies) application fee

APPLY TO RESIDENCE

On-campus housing requires a separate application. Apply early at **umanitoba.ca/housing**. You do not need to hold an offer of admission in order to apply for residence.

2. SUBMIT

SUBMIT DOCUMENTATION

Sign in to your application portal at **apply.umanitoba.ca/apply** to check your status and review the requested documents required to process your application.

Be sure to upload a copy of your interim/predicted scores into your application portal for a preliminary review.

Submit proof of English language proficiency (as required).

Final official transcripts and proof of high school graduation are required. Official documents can be submitted electronically from your home institution to **applicant.services@umanitoba.ca** or by mail to:

Documents issued in a language other than English must be accompanied by a certified English translation.

3. ACCEPT

RECEIVE AND ACCEPT AN OFFER OF ADMISSION

Current high school students may receive a conditional offer of admission based on interim/predicted senior level grades.

Students who apply to the joint ELC plus undergraduate studies option will be assessed for conditional admission to the University of Manitoba.

All offers of admission are subject to a review of final grades.

Offers must be accepted by the deadline indicated in your admission offer.

A standardized letter of acceptance will be available in your application portal once an admission offer is accepted.

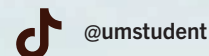
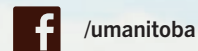
