<p>STEP 1</p> <p>What are you being marked on?</p> <p>List all quizzes, assignments, essays, tests, exams, etc... including those that have not yet occurred.</p>	<p>STEP 2</p> <p>How much is this worth towards your final grade?</p> <p>List how many marks out of 100%.</p>	<p>STEP 3</p> <p>What grade did you receive?</p> <p>List actual mark you got on your assignments, essays, tests, exams, etc.</p>	<p>STEP 4</p> <p>How much did you earn towards your final grade? Record your grade.</p> <p>Watch the video tutorial to learn how to do this calculation, or see example below:</p> $\frac{37}{50} = \frac{7.4}{10}$ <p>$37 \div 50 = 0.74$ $0.74 \times 10 = 7.4$</p>
