HOW TO USE IT

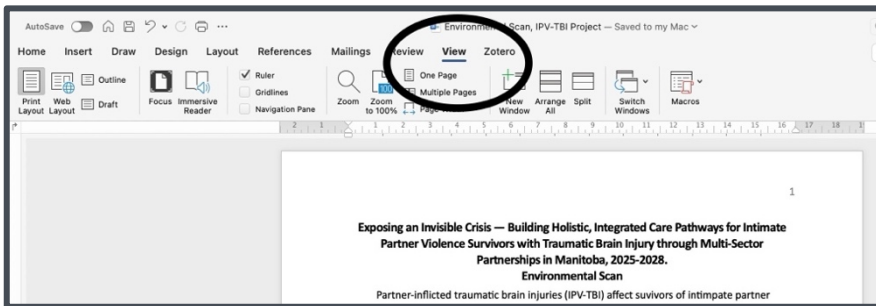
Below is a list of steps to follow to most effectively use this document.

Make sure you open the document in **MS Word** and not another software (like Google Docs or Pages for Mac).

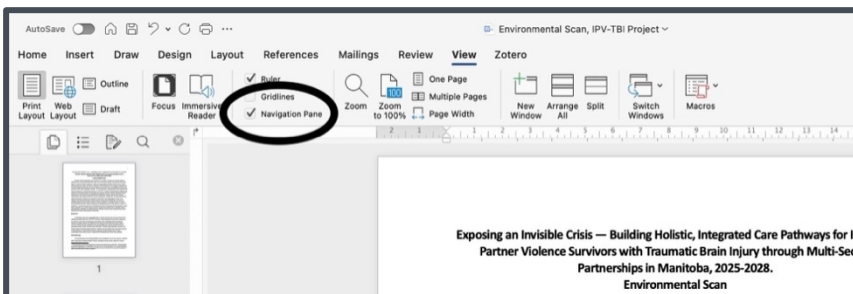

Select the View tab from the ribbon at the top of your screen

Find the Navigation Pane option in the ribbon and check the box next to this text. This step will immediately create a column at the left-hand side of your screen (that's the Navigation Pane).

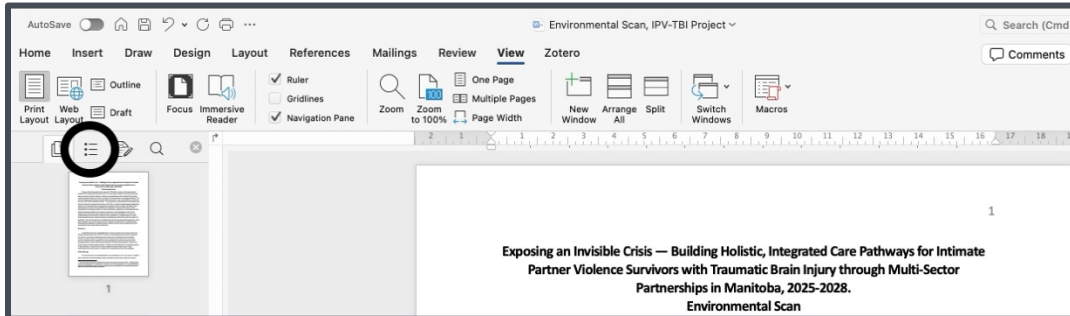
This document is organized into 13 sections:

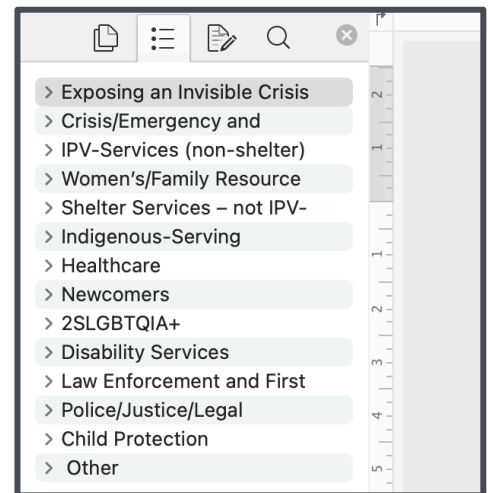

Now that the Navigation Pane is on the left-hand side of your screen, you will need to select the small icon that looks like three bullet points.

Once you have selected the icon with the bullet points, your document is ready for navigation. You will see a list of the larger sections, with drop-down arrows available for selection.

Selecting these drop-down arrows shows you the items and organizations included in each section. Each of these sections can be expanded or collapsed, depending on where you are working in the document. When you select an organization, you will be moved to that section immediately. This tool allows for a more user-friendly experience within the larger document.
