The Wendy Hansen Scholarship

This year marked Dr Jessie Lang's 100th birthday and to celebrate this magnificent occasion, we asked past recipients of the Wendy Hansen Scholarship to share what it meant to receive this award and how it helped them to get to where they are now.

There were many wonderful stories on how the scholarship made a big difference in helping to achieve their dream!

Dr Jessie Lang set up the Wendy Hansen Scholarship Fund as a tribute to her daughter in 1993 and since then it has been awarded to 21 students, making an immeasurable difference in the lives of our students! "The money allowed me to keep my head above water and concentrate on my studies without fear of letting my grades slip. The extra time allowed me to be incredibly successful in my undergrad, and I won the Gold Medal for the highest GPA.

In turn, my academic achievements at St John's College allowed me to be accepted, with full funding, to Queen's University, where last year I completed a Masters of Arts in Geography. I am now a PhD scholar in Geography at Simon Fraser University in Vancouver.

Chaplaincy

Chaplain Allison Chubb continues to develop programs and events that foster relationships with both Residence and Day students.

Some of the programs held throughout the year were: SJC student council leadership retreat and mentorship sessions, a Thanksgiving and Christmas dinner for students, weekly dinner discussion groups, a social justice retreat day, volunteer events for West Broadway CM: walk a mile, and International Day for ending Racism. These create an avenue to foster trust and accountability as well as building future leaders!

Last fall we helped Allison fundraise to sponsor a Syrian Refugee named **Al Montaser Al Jajeh** to live in St John's College residence for two years with board and room fully paid. This program is in partnership with World University Services of Canada (WUSC) through *The Student Refugee Program.* Fundraising events included a Balloon Pop, International Coffee House in the Daily Bread Café and a 80's Social, and a few other fundraisers with students, SJC staff and Fellows. St John's is not just rooms and concrete, it is a community that has been my home and safe haven. St. John's has fostered in me an increased desire to impact my peers and my community. St. John's has been a source of strength, guidance and support that makes me feel and know that my life and my dreams are important. I'm very grateful to all the donors who support St. John's. Continued support for the Health Career Quest Summer Camp

Health Career Quest Summer Camp a two-week camp held in July, is designed to provide opportunities for Northern Manitoba Grade 11 First Nation students to look seriously at a career in the health care profession. Through donations from Heathbridge Capital Management Ltd and private donors, the College is able to provide meals and accommodation for 12 students and their group leaders. The camp participants take part in daily experiences in a variety of health profession including Medicine, Dentistry, Medical Rehabilitation, Nursing and Pharmacy. They enjoyed the safe and caring community of St John's and the experience of what it is like to live in residence!

The Children Rising Mentorship Program

The Children Rising Mentorship Program is an innovative crosscultural learning exchange and mentorship partnership with youth from Skownan First Nation. They learn about Anishinaabe culture through traditional ceremonies, crafts, teachings, and games, while



mentoring other participants. They meet several times a year with student from Skownan First Nation and here at the College. They are paired up and maintain a connection throughout the school year.
