#### **Building a Community – The Difference YOU have made!**

Recently St John's College was asked to provide free room and board for a group of 15 Indigenous Grade 11 students coming to Winnipeg for the Health Career Quest Summer Program. We are happy to provide room and board and we turned to our donors to underwrite the College expenses for the program. With unfailing generosity the donors we approached immediately made contributions and we met our modest target in two weeks. At the same time we have been moving ahead rapidly with the facelift in the residence – painting the rooms, installing cupboard doors and new floors, and refinishing the Buttery and the laundry room. The Fellows raised the funds to have the furniture in the Senior Common refurbished. We have also been building up the Chaplaincy endowment so that we can now hire a part-time Chaplain at the College. All of this work is a result of the generosity of our donors who share the vision of the College to provide and safe and caring environment for students to succeed. Thank you to all of you who donate to sustain and build the vibrant College life students cherish.

#### **FACTS AND FIGURES:**

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES:**

St John's College continues to provide valuable support to our students through scholarships and bursaries which are awarded annually. The students not only have access to a great education, but the scholarships and bursaries recognize their hard work and commitment. This past year 87 scholarships and bursaries were awarded to members of the St John's College community.

#### **LEGACY GIFTS AND BEQUESTS:**

This year the College we have been fortunate to receive legacy gift from two individuals. *Muriel Quirk* a friend of the College for many years left a bequest of \$20,000 to help students succeed. Muriel's gift was placed in an endowed fund the proceeds of which are used as emergency funds for students in need.

George (Ted) Edward Poulter, a grad of 1958 and an educator himself, truly believed in the power of education. He and his wife Edna had already established the Ted & Edna Poulter Scholarship and had just transferred Ted's Insurance policy. Ted and Edna believed the small community environment created by the Residence was something worth investing in and so upon Ted passing in December 2012, the proceeds of the policy went towards renovating the residence rooms. In the midst of sadness a great difference was made for the College and in the lives of our students who come to live and study at St John's College. Several other bequests were received in 2012 for a total of \$86,350, some of which went towards Scholarships.

The Bible and Breakfast continued each month from September to April, on Saturday mornings from 9 am to 11:30 am with approximately 40 to 60 people in attendance. After Morning Prayer and a buffet breakfast prepared by the Daily Bread Café, a lively discussion ensued on the bible text prepared and lead by John.


