# Chaplain's corner with The Rev. Helen Holbrook

Evan Chan graduated in 2023 with a master's degree in music theory. Currently, he is studying for his doctorate in Toronto. Throughout his studies Evan experienced student life pre-COVID, during COVID shut down, and post-COVID return of campus activities.

#### What brought you to St John's and when?

I wanted to discern a spiritual calling; I was seeking Christ. I was raised as a Christian in elementary school and in 2019 I had St John's on my horizon but never got there. Eventually it was the pandemic that led me to connect with Edgar French from U of M Spiritual Care. I joined St John's College in Fall 2020, but I was skeptical. I questioned what it had to offer with its colonial Oxford college system.

#### When did you connect with the **Chaplain and Chaplaincy** programs?

I met Rev Andrew, but I knew he was leaving and chose not to seek a connection. Then I met Rev Helen Holbrook to seek spiritual guidance and learning. I continued to explore my spirituality and met people but I didn't expect much, maybe just church services. However, I did attend meditation, and Gospel based discipleship and spiritual direction (with Rev Helen).

I continued to attend other events like the healing garden, food for the journey and then began to get involved in the College by seeking advice of fellows and administration. Then I felt the pull of the Holy Spirit and decided to seek baptism and confirmation.

#### What other resources/departments did you connect with at St John's College?

In my search for advice about doctoral studies, I met with Dr. Jade Weimer, SJC Dean of Studies, and Dr. Kurt Markstrom, retired fellow, and music professor, to seek advice on doctorial studies. Dr. Weimer shared her experiences in doctoral studies in Toronto. Dr. Markstrom also encouraged me on my intended academic pursuits.

In 2022-23 when I served on the UMSU Student Council I found out St John's had lost its status at UMSU. When I shared this information at Assembly, I received overwhelming support from the Warden and the entire Assembly to work towards a restoration of SJC status at UMSU.

#### What do you take with you from St John's to Toronto?

I'm taking along with me the support and guidance from I received from the Chaplain. Dean of Studies, Administrative staff, and Fellows which helped immensely to set up for the University of Toronto.

#### How do you continue to feed your spiritual walk?

I live at Wycliff and attend services at Trinity where I serve as a sacristan. The Bishop has asked me to be on the search committee for a new Chaplain. I am an organist and pianist for Trinity, and I officiate at morning and evening prayer (Evan loves the high Church language). Eventually I am thinking of becoming a deacon.

## **2023 Convocation and Honorary Degrees**

The 155th Annual 2023 Convocation was held last November in the St John's Chapel. 135 St John's College members graduated from the UM in 2023 with doctoral, master's and bachelor's degrees across various academic disciplines. 11 students graduated with firstclass honours and 21 with distinction. During Convocation St John's College awarded just over \$200,000 (including matching funds from the provincial government) in scholarships and bursaries.

During the convocation ceremony, Dr. Brian Bowman,

recipient of the Doctor of Canon Law (honoris causa) and an alum of the College, reflected on his experience at St John's, where he learned not to be a bystander. "Many of the lessons and habits that I developed here at St John's College have helped to guide my professional path for the past three decades...as a lawyer, as Winnipeg's Mayor, and now as a VP of Canada Life," Dr. Bowman said.

Following his address, Dr. Bowman advised students to leverage their education and network and positively influence the community.

# International student finds her community at St John's

Coming to Canada for her first year of university was a scary yet exciting time for Fatoumatta.

Travelling from Africa to pursue nursing, Fatoumatta started her journey off at University 1, where she found St John's to help her academically and meet new friends like Hamidou, one of the St John's Residence Don's.

"Coming from a small place in Africa, I wanted a small community not just to meet friends but to succeed academically, and St John's is that place for me."

Being an international student, Fatoumatta felt supported on campus. As she got comfortable, she quickly found that diversity was embraced at St John's College, which made her feel at home.

"It's a welcoming place for everyone, no matter your background, who you are, or where you come from; everyone is accepted here. It felt like second home to be with the welcoming staff, endless opportunities, and academic support they provide to help me get through my studies."

As part of her experience at St John's, Fatoumatta has benefited from the scholarships and bursaries, which were more than just financial support for her and her family.

Receiving the Dance Memorial Bursary last year allowed her to continue building the life she wants for herself and her family, including buying fresh groceries for the holiday season and continuing her coursework to get into the Rady Faculty of Health Sciences.
