Dean of Studies Report to Council November 2022

Membership

We have received three more applications for fellowship since our last assembly meeting and the Membership Committee has voted to admit the following applicants:

Visiting Fellow positions (1-year term)

Dr. Shayna Plaut earned her PhD from the University of British Columbia in 2014. Since relocating to Winnipeg in August 2017, she has been the lead researcher and project manager for several research projects with strong provincial and municipal policy implications. She served as the Project Manager and Community Researcher for Assisting Renters, a project that brought together the Manitoba Non-Profit Housing Association, the Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives-Manitoba and two professors at the University of Manitoba – Drs. Sarah Cooper and Jesse Hajer. They designed a mixed-methods research project to learn what is working, what's not and what can be better about Manitoba's Rent Assist program. After a year of data collection and analysis, and the dawn of COVID pandemic, they released the report May 2020, through a virtual launch. As the CBC and the Provincial Government both announced in April 2022, the report has helped (re)shape some of Manitoba policy around tax credits and rent assist.

Dr. Julia Smith is an Assistant Professor in Labour Studies at the University of Manitoba. She earned her PhD in 2016 from Trent University and she is a research affiliate at the Centre for Human Rights Research. Her work focuses on the intersection between labour relations, gender, and class distinctions and she currently has several manuscripts awaiting publication, including a volume she is co-editing with Lisa Pasolli called *Rethinking Feminist History and Theory: Reflections on Gender, Class, and Labour*.

Dr. Jacques Aymeric-Nsangou is post-doctoral fellow of the Swiss National Science Foundation, working here at the University of Manitoba with Dr. Kent Fowler. He earned his PhD in 2015 from the Archeology University of Geneva. He published a recent manuscript on ancient fortification practices in Senegal.

Warden's Report to Council, November 2022

Alumni Relations

Since Council last met, I have made a number of trips to connect with our alumni and donors across Canada. Jackie Markstrom met with several Johnians in Toronto, and I have also been part of recent events hosted by UM External Relations in Vancouver, Calgary, Brandon, and Winnipeg. I also met individually or in small groups with our alumni during these trips, and continue to do so locally as well. We had a very successful Convocation on November 6 where we welcomed many Johnians back to the College. People have been very happy to be meeting in person again with the full re-opening of our campus, and there has been a lot of enthusiasm expressed about the projects we're working to develop and the future direction of the College more generally.

Residence Renewal/Capital Campaign

During our recent visits with alumni, discussions about a potential renovation and expansion of the residence and food service areas, and a broader physical renewal of the College, have been very positive. We continue to develop plans for re-launching the capital campaign to reflect these goals, with a priority being a clear estimate of potential costs and how they can be phased. We have been assigned a project manager with UM's Architectural and Engineering Services, and are working with him to confirm the scope and cost of the project.

Academic

I continue to teach the "History of Britain from 1485" for the History Department and am enjoying it very much. I was pleased to share some of my research about WWII secret agents with fellows and staff at the first Soup & Bread lecture of the new academic year. From Oct. 10-13, I attended the North American Conference on British Studies in Chicago, where I served on two panels, including a roundtable to honour and discuss the scholarly impact of my dissertation supervisor, Dr. Sonya Rose, who passed away in 2020.

- I was invited to give the sermon for Consecration Sunday at St. Margaret's Anglican Church on Oct. 30.
- I continue to sit on the Ministry Development Working Group for the Diocese.

- I attended the funeral services for former College librarian, Jim Blanchard.
- I served on the search committee to hire a new development coordinator for the College.
- I attended two banquets put on by our residence council to celebrate the fall term and then Halloween.
- I attended Food for the Journey on Advent traditions with Rev. Jamie Howison on Nov. 19.
- On Oct. 26, we held our first “SJC Orientation” for new fellows, staff, Council members, and SJCSA members. It was a great opportunity for people new to the College to learn about SJC and get to know each other.
- I attended several professional development workshops for senior administrators: Development for Deans, Creating a Positive Culture in your Unit, and the Role of the Elder in your Faculty.
- I continue to represent the College at meetings of Dean’s Council, Provost’s Council, University Senate, Faculty of Arts Council, and Diocesan Council.

Bursar’s report to Council November 23rd 2022

College Operations/Financial

The full return to campus and resumption of in person classes has had a very positive effect on our revenues. Below is a sample of key revenue lines, and their percentage increases as of the end of September compared to last year:

The September 2022-23 operating statements distributed for this meeting also include a YTD column for 2019-20 to provide a comparable to our last “normal” year prior to the pandemic. Clearly, we still have a ways to go, but keep in mind that from April – August we were still under restrictions.

Residence Operations

Our residence has been near 80% capacity this term, with a combination of regular residents and the continuing contract with the Province of MB for housing Ukrainian refugees. We are considering extending the contract for the winter term, subject to the province’s need for ongoing refugee housing. We’ve had a number of refugees express their gratitude to the College for providing them with a safe and welcoming environment during their transition to permanent housing, and that has been extremely gratifying.

Food Services

Catering and the Daily Bread Café continue to be busy. Soup4U (formerly Pizza Joe's), our outlet in the Galleria outside the Schultz Theatre opened the first week of November.

Audit

The audit was completed successfully. Pam Dupuis, partner at BDO Canada, presented for both the Finance & Administration Committee and College Council. Finance & Administration recommended they be approved, which Council subsequently did.

CRA

In October we provided our Lawyers with responses to official "undertakings" that resulted from the examination for discovery deposition. These were answers to questions posed to us by Crown Counsel that we asked for more time to produce. Our lawyer was pleased with our responses and passed them along to the Crown Counsel. We are awaiting word on any further discussions regarding a settlement.

Dean of Residence Report – November 2022

Residence Projects

The Dons Team conducted a residence inspection on November 1 and identified 21 rooms requiring routine window maintenance. Rooms are generally being kept in good/sanitary condition, with no rooms requiring significant remedial attention by students to bring them up to standard.

Fall and Winter Sessions

As of 10 November our full Fall Session contingent has arrived. Student visa processing timelines continue to pose a significant issue for international students attempting to make accommodation plans. Four students have applied for residence for the Winter Session. We also expect to welcome two students who applied during the summer but had indicated their intention to only attend for the Winter Session. I continue to receive new applications every few days. There have been no significant discipline issues.

I had opportunities to advertise the residence at an online ICM open house on 19 November and the University Open House on 25 November, both of which were well attended.

Ukrainian Refugees

The residence continues to host Ukrainian Refugees on behalf of the Department of Families. We've begun to put out feelers regarding whether the province intends to renew past December 23, 2022 but haven't yet had a response. Having refugees living in the residence has been an overwhelmingly positive experience, and I continue to regularly receive written and verbal words of thanks for the welcoming environment refugees have experienced during their time in College.

Residence Activity

The Residence Council has struggled to get off the ground, but Bryan Oforikuma, Co-President of the Council has hosted two successful banquets (the Welcome Back banquet on September 29 and the Halloween banquet on October 28), both of which were well-attended by students and refugee residents alike.

Based on information discussions with other members of the University, community building is a general issue this year.

The Dons hosted an in-house movie night during October along with a pumpkin carving evening after the Halloween banquet. Neither event was very well attended.

I continue to work with Bryan Oforikuma on ways we can provide opportunities for our residents to get out of their rooms and meet new friends.

Senior Stick Report

UMSU

Myself and the SJCSA USMU representative, Evan Chan, met with the UMSU president and other UMSU executives on October 12th alongside St Paul's leadership to discuss the Colleges' voting status and financing.

Positive News

We have received \$13 000 from UMSU after not receiving funding for 1.5 years. We will receive further funds this year.

Not so Positive News

Unfortunately, we were unable to secure our voting membership. The reasoning the UMSU executives gave to removing St Paul's and St John's as voting members was that they wished to eliminate double representation. This means for example, I am a student in the Faculty of Science so I would be represented by the Faculty on UMSU. However, I am also a member of St John's College and so I would be also represented by the College on UMSU meaning I would receive double representation. However, there are inconsistencies to this new mandate as the Student Communities such as Indigenous, International, Students with Disabilities, 2SLGBTQ+ students, Black students and the Womyn's community have regained their right to vote and represent their students on UMSU. Thus there is still double representation on UMSU. The reasoning the UMSU executives gave to this was that these students do not choose to be in these communities, but they do if they are members of the Colleges due to membership fees. Another reason UMSU gave in response to an email for eliminating our voting rights was that they wished to make meetings shorter. However, there was inconsistencies to this reasoning as well as the UMSU president spoke to this in our meeting and communicated that this was never a goal of UMSU. This is in contradiction to the email sent to me in August and the St Paul's Senior Stick who was part of UMSU in the past. Due to these inconsistencies, in the new year, alongside St Paul's, we are going to bring an official motion to the Board of Governor's and have it sent to the Governance Committee for review followed by an official BOG vote. Hopefully, we will regain our voting rights in the next year or two.
