As Rector of St. Paul's College (SPC), I am pleased to present the Statistical Report for the 2014-15 academic year. I hope you will find this report interesting with the wide range of facts provided about our students, faculty and staff. Some interesting highlights include:

- 1,259 University of Manitoba (U of M) students joined SPC, an increase of 9.8%.
- Our students use the College as a springboard for launching successful careers. This includes 265 students in the Arts and Humanities, 261 in Sciences, and 133 in Business. Many of our students are also in Health Sciences, Law, and Engineering.
- This past year, 359 undergraduate students came from across campus to enroll in Catholic Studies offered by the Jesuit Centre for Catholic Studies at SPC.
- The Joint MA with the University of Winnipeg and PhD program in Peace and Conflict Studies are thriving programs housed in the Arthur V. Mauro Centre for Peace and Justice. Many scholarships are provided by the College's Foundation with donor support.
- Our faculty continues to be drawn from a wide range of U of M departments, and consists of 20 Regular Faculty Assembly members as well as numerous associate members and scholars. In 2015, we were proud to learn that Dr. Haskel Greenfield was appointed "Distinguished Professor" by the U of M's Board of Governors.

In creating this report, our College acknowledges tremendous support from the U of M's Office of Institutional Analysis and Registrar's Office, with special thanks to Thelma Lussier, Randy Roller, Wen Trask, and Shan Rogers. In addition, we appreciate the hard work of Randall Kinley, who coordinated the project, and Siri Kousonsavath, who created and edited the report, and managed its design, layout and print production. A big thanks goes also to those who helped proofread the various drafts prior to finalization.

The College appreciates all the good things our students, faculty and staff do each day to make this a great community within the larger U of M community!

Student Membership

- A total of 1,259 University of Manitoba (U of M) students registered as members of St. Paul's College (SPC), as recorded at November 1, 2014.
- In 2014, 176 student members of SPC graduated from the U of M. 43 students graduated at the Fall Convocation and 133 students graduated at the Spring Convocation.
- In 2014, 828 of the eligible 1,001 student members, or 83% of students returning to the U of M in the 2014-15 academic year continued as College members.
- In the 2014-2015 regular academic year, the majority of SPC students were enrolled in University 1 (15%), Science (21%), and Arts (21%).
- In the 2014-15 regular academic year, the gender composition of SPC membership comprised 50% males and 50% females.

Course Offerings

- In the 2014-15 regular academic year, a wide range of courses from 15 faculties and schools were offered at SPC with a total of 176 course and tutorial sections of which 50 courses were taught by College faculty members.

Area of Emphasis

- In the 2014-15 regular academic year, SPC offered a Catholic Studies program and, through the Faculty of Graduate Studies, a PhD program in Peace and Conflict Studies.
- The PhD program in Peace and Conflict Studies is now in its sixth year of implementation. In 2014-15, there were 15 graduate course sections of Peace and Conflict Studies.
- The BA (Minor) in Catholic Studies is now in its 14th year of implementation. In 2014-15, there were four offerings of CATH 1190 in the fall (enrolment of 170) and three offerings in the winter (enrolment of 168) for a total of 338 students, one offering of CATH 2000 with nine students, CATH 2010 and 2020 with eight students, and CATH 3900 with four students.

Faculty Membership

As of November 5, SPC faculty membership included:

- 20 individuals with regular membership status
- Nine individuals with associate membership status
- 13 individuals with research fellow status
- Two visiting scholars
- 14 senior scholars





Chart 2: U of M Enrolment (2010-15 | at November 1) | Source: U of M Office of Institutional Analysis





Chart 4: Number of Female & Male SPC Student Members (2011-15)






Chart 5: Gender Composition (2014-15)





Introduction

We gratefully acknowledge financial support for St. Paul's College (SPC) Campus Ministry programs and services from the Archdiocese of Winnipeg, St. Paul's College Foundation Inc., as well as other donors. Without this support, much of the services we provided to those within our community would not be possible. The SPC Students' Association has been extraordinary in their collaboration and support (including financial) of campus ministry and special College liturgies and events.

In his address (Oct 17, 2014) to the Catholic University Federation, Pope Francis—in the spirit of his encyclical *The Joy of the Gospel*—referred to the importance of being close to those we serve in their joys and hopes and struggles. This is the bottom line of the spiritual and pastoral care of campus ministry, and much of our time was spent assisting students with moral and spiritual concerns related to the integrity of their being as they pursue their academic and professional aspirations. This has been the most important aspect of our ministry. The SPC Campus Ministry team collaborated sincerely and joyfully in the service of the Gospel.

Our continued membership and collaboration with the Canadian Catholic Campus Ministry (CCCM) and Canadian Catholic Students' Association (CCSA) is a stimulus for offering competent, human and spiritual resources to students and staff, who search for the "magis" characteristic of Ignatian spirituality and ontological in the human person. Evangelization is a key component of our ministry but is always within the necessary comprehensive dimensions of: campus presence, catechesis, community involvement, ecumenical and interfaith involvement, a culture of vocations, faith community and hospitality, justice and service, leadership development, lectures and retreats, pastoral care, and prayer and sacraments.


Last fall, Sr. Elaine Baete received an invitation from Cardinal Veglio of the Pontifical Council for Migrants to participate in a Vatican Work-Study Session (Oct 9-12, 2014). 50 campus ministers from five continents were there to help establish pastoral guidelines for campus ministry in Catholic colleges and universities around the world. With donations (especially from the archdioceses of Winnipeg and St. Boniface), fundraising and a personal contribution through Sr. Elaine's religious congregation to support the expenses, a presentation was prepared describing the challenges and outreach that our campus ministry, local and national renders to and for students. A final report of this work-study session from the Vatican is in progress.

Sr. Elaine Baete continued to be a member of the Global Connections Social Justice Committee, CCCM and Professional Development Committee of the CCCM. Teleconference meetings were held monthly to plan and promote projects on Catholic social teaching and activities amongst the students we served locally, nationally and internationally. Through the local Catholic Students' Association, student volunteers met twice per term. A community of friendship and support was established through their activities, and they were encouraged to organize events and hone their leadership skills. We also engaged executive members of Students for a Culture of Life and Couples for Christ Youth For Christ as a dynamic part of our campus ministry program.

They received a small stipend for their assistance with liturgy and various activities including university orientation assistance. Meetings with them were usually held monthly and more often as needed, depending on specific activities and events that required planning. Several meetings were also held with the student leaders of Couples for Christ Youth For Christ, in order to collaborate and organize activities together.

Spiritual Development

After summer break, weekly 11:00 am Sunday Mass resumed (Aug 17, 2014-Jun 28, 2015). Weekday Mass resumed Tuesdays to Fridays at 11:45 am (Aug 26, 2014-Jun 26, 2015). We celebrated Christmas Eve Mass (8:00pm Dec 24, 2014) and the chapel was closed until Sunday Mass resumed (Jan 4, 2015).

We are grateful to Fr. Eduardo Soto, SJ who presided weekday liturgies when Fr. Michael Koryluk had other commitments. On February 18, 2015 the 11:45 am Ash Wednesday Mass with Distribution of the Ashes was held with a large gathering of campus Catholics in Christ the King Chapel.

In addition to Easter Triduum liturgies (Apr 2-4, 2015) with Holy Thursday, Good Friday Way of the Cross on Campus, and Easter Vigil), special liturgical celebrations held in the chapel included:

Intercultural Liturgies

In keeping with the call for intercultural dialogue in Catholic education, we welcomed students' initiative to organize liturgies in their culture and language with translation available through the Sunday Bulletin. We celebrated Hispanic Mass in the spirit of Our Lady of Guadalupe (Dec 14, 2014) with help from Fr. Eduardo Soto, SJ. African Mass (Jan 18, 2015) was organized by students from our faith community. Couples for Christ Youth For Christ organized the Filipino Mass (Feb 8, 2015). A potluck followed each of the mass.

Reading & Discussion on Pope Francis' Encyclical Light of Faith

Due to demands on the students, gatherings were held from October until April to discuss a chapter of the Joy of the Gospel.

Barn Mass

Held at the Giesbrecht Farm near Niverville (Dec 7, 2014), this Advent liturgy provides the framework to help prepare for the coming of Jesus that we celebrate at Christmas.

National Catholic Students' Week (Feb 1-8, 2015)

Encouraged by the CCSA to organize events that celebrate our faith on campus, we were delighted Archbishop Gagnon presided at the Weekday Mass (Feb 4) and joined students afterwards in Hanley Hall for a "brown bag" lunch.

Rites of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This weekly catechesis group gathering forming young people into the Catholic faith included two students asking for reception into the Catholic Church and three students asking for completion of the Sacraments of Initiation. All of them were African students. RCIA continues to Pentecost.

Liturgy-based Bible Study

With exceptions for special events, Liturgy-based Bible Study was held about every three weeks throughout the academic year.

Retreats

A Day at the Trappist Monastery was held in Holland, MB (Sep 20, 2014). In collaboration with St John's College and chaplain Allison Chubb, a silent retreat (Nov 14-15, 2015) was hosted by St. Charles Retreat Center-Chemin Neuf Community. The Catholic Foundation provided support which enabled several students to participate in this weekend prayer time. Two RCIA retreats were held this past year for interested students (Dec 13, 2014 and Mar 21, 2015). Thanks to the Catholic Foundation for funding these as well!

National Canadian Catholic Students' Association Conference

Two students attended this conference (Oct 16-19, 2014) at St. Joseph's College, University of Alberta.

Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius in Daily Life [Annotation 19]

One student faithfully journeyed through this demanding year-round retreat. These are daily prayer exercises which help committed individuals grow in their relationship with the Lord and develop a sense of discernment in their lives.

Vocation Discernment

With the support of Archbishop LeGatt, a Vocation Discussion Evening was held in Hanley Hall (Nov 18, 2014). Many students participated and this was one of the highlights of this past year's activities. Archbishop Gagnon also attended this event. A follow up gathering is being planned.

We are committed to assisting young people discern their vocation across the board: single life, marriage, priesthood and consecrated/religious life. As a way of highlighting the World Day of Consecrated Life, a Discernment Retreat Day for Diocesan Priesthood was organized by Fr. Kevin Bettens and promoted at SPC with at least one of our students attending.

Ecumenical & Interfaith

Our meetings, prayer celebrations and outreach activities with other members of the U of M Chaplains' Association were held on and off campus. Some members of our community participated in different gatherings during the Festival of Prayer-Week of Christian Unity (Jan 18-25, 2015).

Again this year, many of our students and Sunday Mass participants took part in the Hillel Students' Association Interfaith-Passover Seder Meal and tour (Mar 22, 2015) at Sharrey-Zedek Synagogue.

Cults & Religious Movements

Aware of the potential of cults and unhealthy religious movements that can occur on campus, we worked with the U of M Chaplains' Association and Campus Security in this regard. Fortunately this year, there have not been events of this nature.

Therefore, we invited students to be active agents in contemporary events working for life, development, dignity of those in the struggle against poverty, and to stand for authentic values in the many challenges encountered every day in a manner consistent with the Gospel. In this spirit, we offered activities to and for students, and encouraged them to take initiative by reaching out.

Stony Mountain Institution (SMI) Outreach

22 students and alumni were committed to the outreach at SMI (Sep 27, 2014-Mar 28, 2015). Preparations for these monthly visits involved participation in an orientation session, as well as reflection and sharing on liturgical readings.

Development & Peace (D&P)

This year, several students participated in D&P Fall Action workshops. They brought information and resources to the Catholic Students' Association and were invited to share them with the Sunday worship community. For Solidarity Sunday, a collection was taken in support of the Share Lent campaign and will be forwarded to the head office to help those in need.

Students for a Culture for Life (Pro-life)

A group of Catholic, ecumenical and interfaith students on campus are organized as a pro-life group. Some of these students collaborated and participated in our Catholic Students' Association meetings. One of the methods of collaboration is the Advent collection of goods to support expectant and new mothers at Villa Rosa. Donations, financial and material, have been forwarded to them. We also promoted events such as the March for Life.

Winnipeg Harvest Volunteering

This was a kick-off outreach event for National Catholic Students' Week (Feb 1-8, 2015). We also invited our Sunday worshippers to contribute items to our U of M Students' Union Food Bank hamper.

Inner City Ministry & Other Volunteer Opportunities

Several students have been motivated to volunteer in various parts of the city and we encourage them to do so. Some assisted at Agape Table and Siloam Mission. A couple of students volunteered at Victoria Hospital and Deer Lodge. We have a connection with the Archeparchy through the Redemptorist Welcome Home on Euclid Avenue and helped them with the Gift Wrapping Bee for inner city children before Christmas. We also collected items (socks, mitts, scarves, hotel soaps, and shampoos) for Our Place Chez Nous Drop-In Centre Inc. on Main Street.

Amazing Race, Amazing Grace Service Learning Pilgrimage Challenge in Montréal, Québec

Four students participated in this prayerful and active social justice awareness week (Feb 14-21, 2015), which involved volunteer work among the poor, as well as visiting significant spiritual and historical sites and the McGill Campus Ministry Newman Centre. Thanks to the religious congregations who helped support this program.

Social Activities


