Duties:

- Assist program co-ordinator with research using UM library databases for relevant literature -- traditional knowledge, water, Indigenous well-being, Indigenous science.
- Assist in survey and data collection
- Assist program co-ordinator with pre-conference tasks
- Depending on the successful candidate's schedule, opportunity to visit First Nation community with CREATE H2O graduate students

Qualifications:

- Be a full time student in fall & winter terms
- Have a **2016-2017 government loan** or full **Indigenous sponsorship**
- Ideal candidate will be of **Indigenous descent** and studying in the fields of science, environment & geography, agriculture or engineering. Other fields of study that may be helpful for this position -- Native studies, Indigenous languages, natural resources etc.
- Eagerness to learn about the issues that Indigenous peoples face in Canada, including colonialism
- Eagerness to learn about water issues in First Nation communities i.e. – water quality, sediment and flooding, safe-drinking water, contaminants etc.
- Working knowledge of library databases to conduct literature reviews
